Application

The application is an online process and students will receive the instructions to complete it after receiving a nomination from the Sending Institution. The home institution will also receive the first message with instructions via cc.

Checklist for a complete application:

- ✓ Learning Agreement
- ✓ For non-native speakers: Spanish and/or English language certificate of a B2 (upperintermediate) or superior level, depending on the language of instruction chosen by the student. Both official certificates and recommendation letters issued by the home university will be accepted.
- ✓ Transcript of Records in English or Spanish
- ✓ Copy of first page of Passport (non-EU students) or Identity Document (EU students)
- ✓ Copy of a private international health insurance or European Health Insurance Card covering the entire period of the mobility
- ✓ Photograph

Assessment and Grading System

1) Assessment system: The assessment system used at the Abat Oliba CEU University is based on the idea that students are evaluated throughout, and not only at the very end of the academic term (Continuous Assessment).

According to the university's continuous assessment system, the final exam grade must not count for more than 50% of the final course grade, which means that assignments, workshops, seminars and other activities undertaken throughout the semester must count for at least 50% of the course final grade.

2) Grading system: Following the Spanish grading system, students at the Abat Oliba CEU University are assessed using a 10-point grading scale, with 10 being the highest and 0 being the lowest grade.

9-10 points	→	Outstanding ("Sobresaliente")
7-8.9 points	→	Remarkable ("Notable")
5-6.9 points	→	Pass ("Aprobado")
0-4.9 points	→	Failed ("Suspenso")

3) Class attendance: According to the Abat Oliba CEU University regulations, students are compelled to attend all classes, seminars and workshops, with a maximum of 20 % of absences.

Additional absences will result in a reduction of 0.5 point for each extra absence from the continuous assessment grade.

Accommodation

In Barcelona, sharing a flat seems to be the most common choice among local and international students. The UAO CEU collaborates with Barcelona Centre Universitari (BCU), the biggest reservation center in the city offering various types of accommodation (rooms in shared flats, student residences, hosting families).

Public Transport

Using public transport in Barcelona is very easy and recommendable. In addition, special discount for young people under 30 is available getting the T-Jove card, a card valid for 3 months for 44€.
